



Wistaston Parish Council **Chairman's Report**

1. United Utilities (UU) Better Rivers programme

Further to the initial notification a site meeting has been held including Council members to provide more details on the next stage in their plans.

Key objectives are to a) Improve health of rivers and b) Reduce the frequency of storm overflows.

Starting on the 19th August site surveys and excavation work on land adjacent to the brook will be undertaken in preparation to move electricity power cables underground in April 2025 and install large collection tanks. A letter from UU will be circulated to local residents and they are planning to hold local meetings with residents. More details can be found on their website

2. Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB)

There has been a significant rise in ASB during recent months in woodlands and open spaces across Joey the Swan.

These include increased litter and general dumping, excavation work in Hinging Bank woodland where the Badger set is for a cycle track, a major fire close to the Poplar trees, Motorcycles across the open football areas and damaged memorial trees in the arboretum section.

Resident help is sought to report incidents to the Police helpline Tel 101 and/or report to our Clerk.

Wistaston Village Cricket Club

(Founded 1980)

As I compose this editorial the cricketing season has been active for a little over two months and by the time this latest editorial finds its way through your letterbox, the 2024 cricketing campaign would be virtually completed, which begs again, the question, where does the time go.

Our First XI competing in The Cheshire Cricket League Division 3, have at the time of compiling this latest editorial, completed just under half of their cricketing programme and are currently 4th position in their table having won half of their fixtures and of the three matches that they lost, two were extremely close matches with another two abandoned. Having recorded their last two matches as victories, the season very much open for more successes. Record so far: Played 10 Won 5 Lost 3 Abandoned 2 Pts 98.

Our Second XI competing in The North Stafford South Cheshire Cricket League **Division 8** have had a harder season to contend with and at present holding 7th position in a league of nine clubs. The season commenced in May and they are competing in a strong league. In their last match held on 16th June they had a positive 30 run victory over Church Eaton and suffered a defeat in a very close-run match against Oakamoor C.C. by just three runs. With half of their playing season still to come, there is optimism on attaining even a higher final position in their league. Record so far: - Played 8 Won 2 Lost 5 Abandoned 1 Pts 62

Our ladies eleven "The Swans", competing in Division 4 (West) of Women's Cricket League currently as I write, are in second position in their league. From their opening five fixtures they have recorded three victories with two losses, (both against **Oakmere C.C.** by a single and two runs respectively) and have accumulated an excellent **86 points**, just **14 points** behind leaders **Oakmere C.C.** Watch this space. Record so far: - Played 5 Won 3 Lost 2 Abandoned Pts 86

In the Division 5 Softball South League, "The Swans" are in 4th position from 5 teams. However, they have played to date the fewest fixtures and will be looking to improve on that position by the conclusion of the playing season.

Our junior sides are competing in their respective leagues within The Cheshire South Cheshire Junior Cricket League.

Under 9's

Playing in a league of 18 teams, our Under 9's are conducting their campaign very well and at the time of this editorial they hold 6^{th} position in the league with 70 points from their opening ten fixtures.

Under 11's Our Under 11's are contesting in a league containing 15 teams. Currently they hold 7th position having won two of their eight opening fixtures and losing four, with a further match abandoned and another victory gained when their opponents had conceded the fixture. Watch this space.

Under 13's: The season so far for our **Under 13's** has been somewhat demanding but the experience of playing and learning will I'm sure, keep them in good stead. The most important thing is to enjoy the sport. In a league of **15 teams**, the

Under 13's are currently in 12th position with 25 points, having played some very close matches which could have gone either way.

Friendly XI's: Finally, our cricket club have a programme of inter-club and Sunday friendly fixtures, which accommodates players of extra experience and opportunities of playing the game.

The stage was full of fabulous flowers and arrangements. Pictured is Mark with one of his stunning arrangements.



NATURE ARTICLE

In April Valerie Bentley of Princess Drive, on reading the nature article, rang to mention a jay had been seen for eight years in succession, passing into the thick trees dividing her large garden from the main road, but never nesting. These shy birds are seldom far from trees, and, although concealing themselves in woodlands more than other corvids will, as, is proven here, are happy to visit town parks and gardens. The blood-curdling screech is characteristic, the white rump distinctive in flight. Acorns are an important survival food in winter, often buried for future use.

On 21 April Tony Harding saw his first swallows during a visit to his daughter at Red Hall Farm. Tony is keen to compare annual arrival dates.

We've witnessed the strange phenomenon of starlings descending en masse in a frenzy of pecking on the lawn. Have others noticed this explosion? A few hectic minutes and all will have gone, peace restored. Seen less and less these days, these birds continue to breed, family groups still visiting us to feed, noisy squabbling for parental attention not always rewarded.

The hotter, sunnier, days produce the occasional scream of our diminishing swifts, mingled with twitter of swallows, too high up to discern. Wood pigeons forever play the mating game, and it was strange to catch a stock dove displaying to a pigeon, being so much smaller and daintier.

Butterflies have been scarce, blues and a brimstone crossing the garden, but with even a dearth of the ubiquitous whites, perhaps proof of a chillier than normal start to Summer.

Mammalwise, at 4.30a.m., 12 June, Robert Day of Sandylands Park, watched a fox run from his neighbour's back garden. He believes the sight of him at the window might have startled it (bet you wouldn't hurt a fly, Robert!). The previous week Robert had seen a fox heading for the allotments opposite ourselves in Sandylands, having caught something. Yes, we are privileged to see foxes now and then, sometimes in broad daylight.

Later in June the Booths of Freshfields noticed a red kite flying over towards the park, a rare and beautiful sight.

They also photographed a great Spotted woodpecker feeding out of a coconut shell.



The predominance of sporting events, not to mention a General Election, may be eclipsing our concentration on the 'Great Outdoors', but it is a relief to acknowledge it will still be there when all the excitement is over!



Once upon a time in Kosowa

Klara and her two sisters and brother were born in Kosowa, a small town in rural Poland in the 1930s. 
